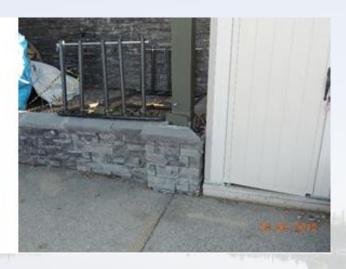

- Alberta CFEP matching grant of \$45K received

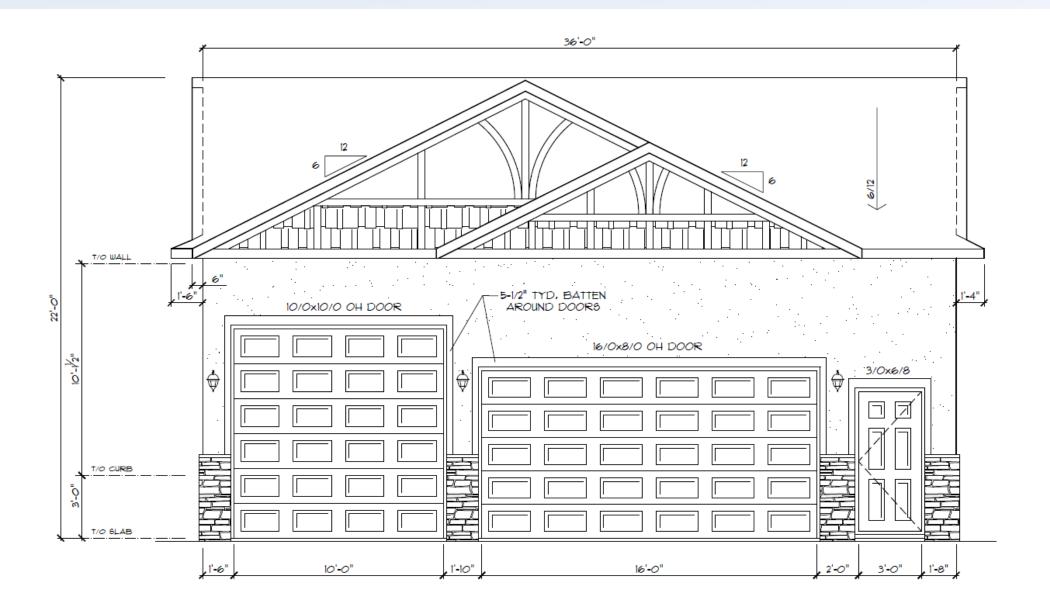

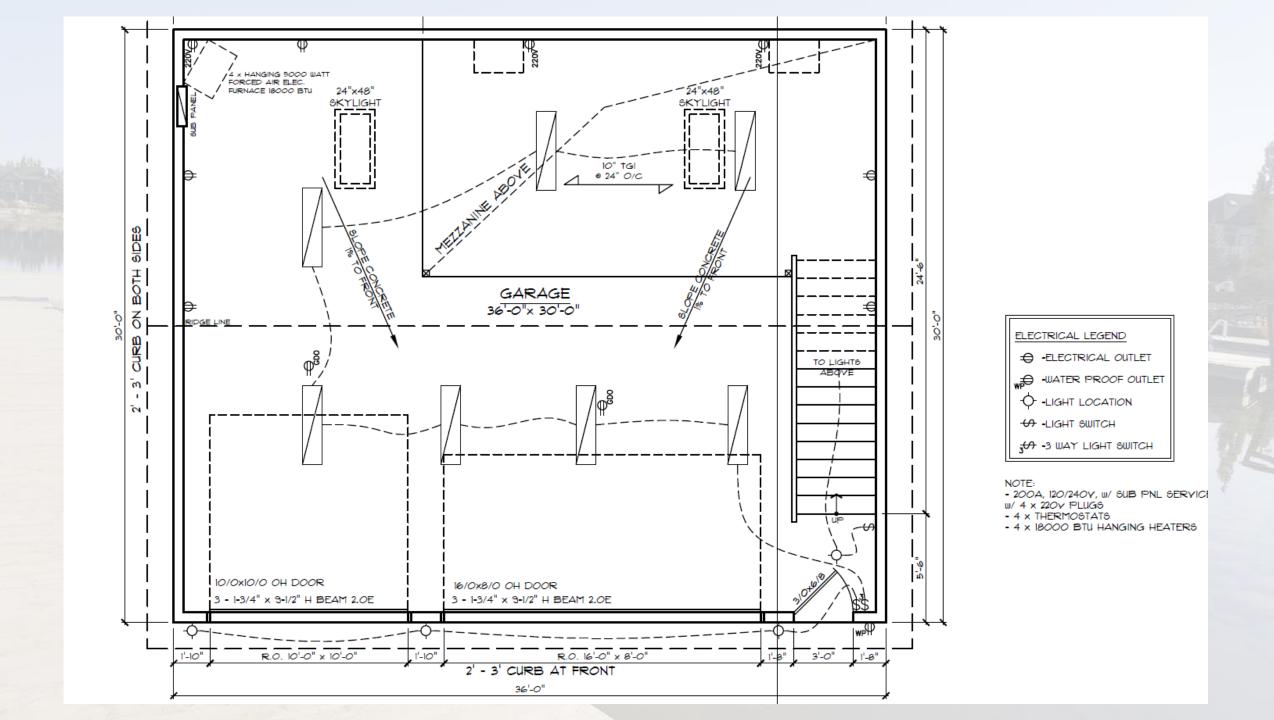

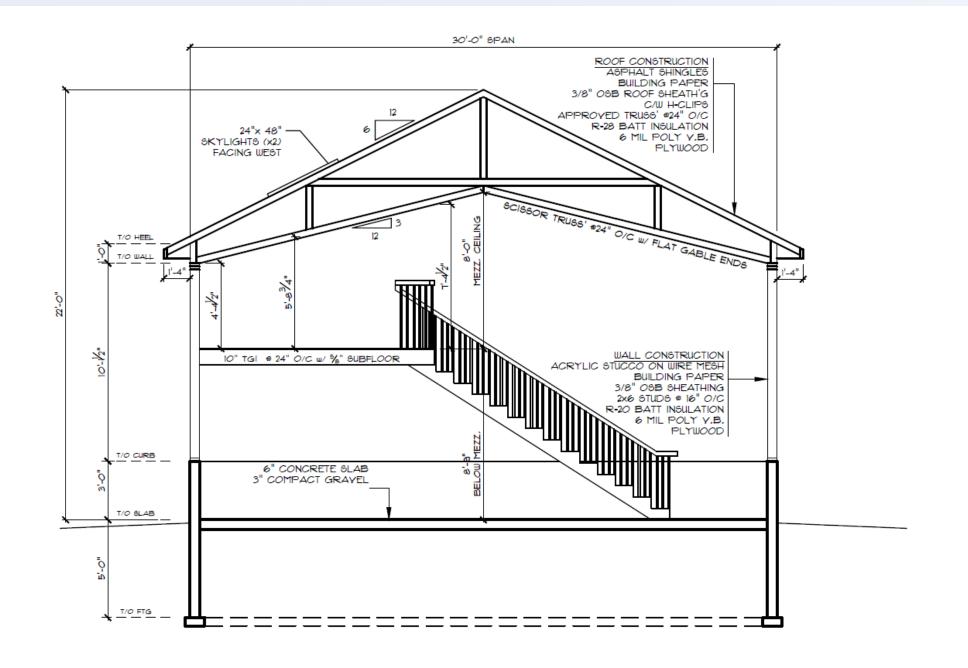






FRONT ELEVATION





The Pump System

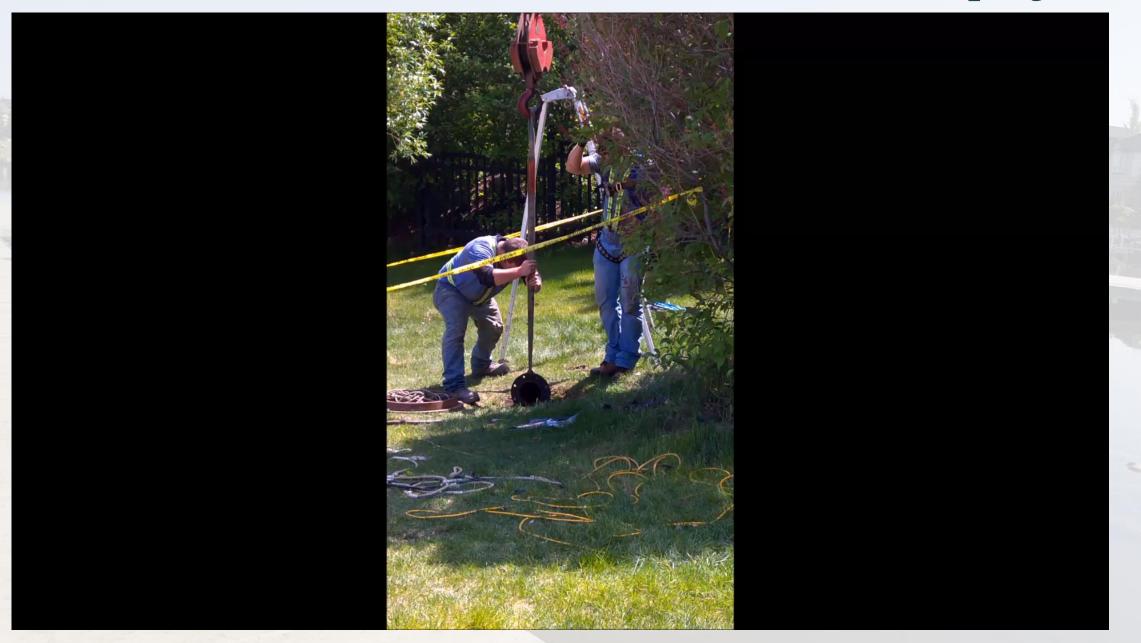




- Spring 2016, main pump and motor failed
- Critical to circulation of water from the Main Lake to the Upper Lake
- Key to green space irrigation systems
- Pump system is original installed 15 years ago
- Replacement pump and motor plus installation \$24K from cash on hand



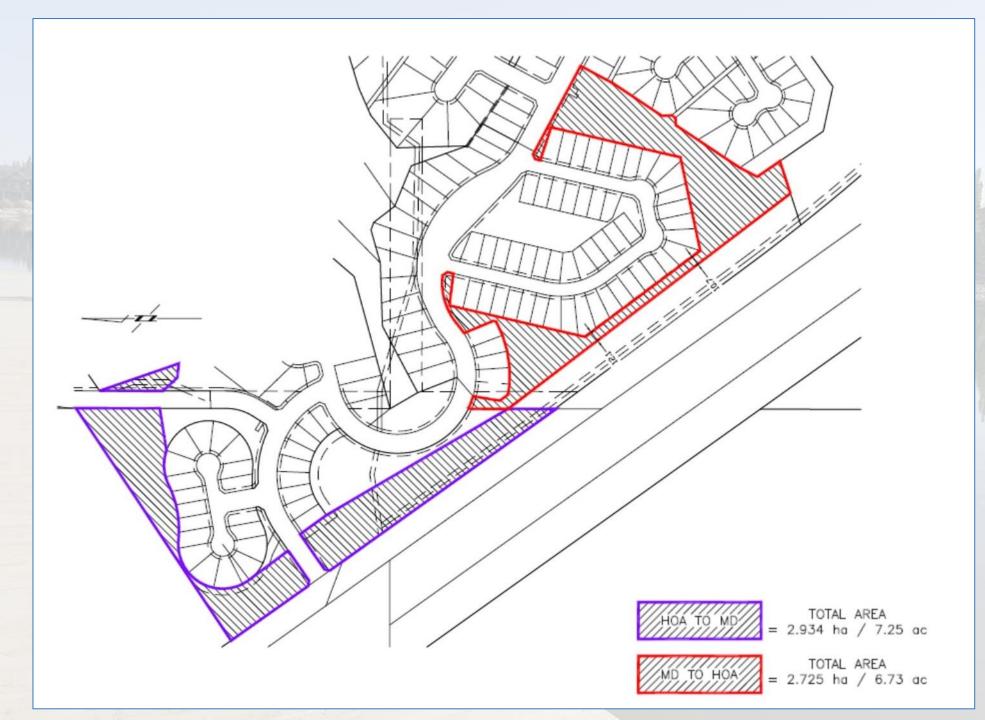
The Pump System

Environmental Stewardship

• 60% of residents engage in curbside blue-box recycling, up from approximately 30% one year ago.

Over the past three years, disposal charges at the MD of Foothills
 Landfill site increased by 34% per metric ton; this trend will continue.

REMEMBER!

- FOUR types of waste going to Landfill <u>can</u> be reduced to ONE.
- How do we maximize our investment?
 - Put grass in <u>clear</u> bags to identify they are NOT waste;
 - Place out recycling in either a bin or clear bag;
 - Deposit household organic waste in the green organics bin residing at the Lake House.

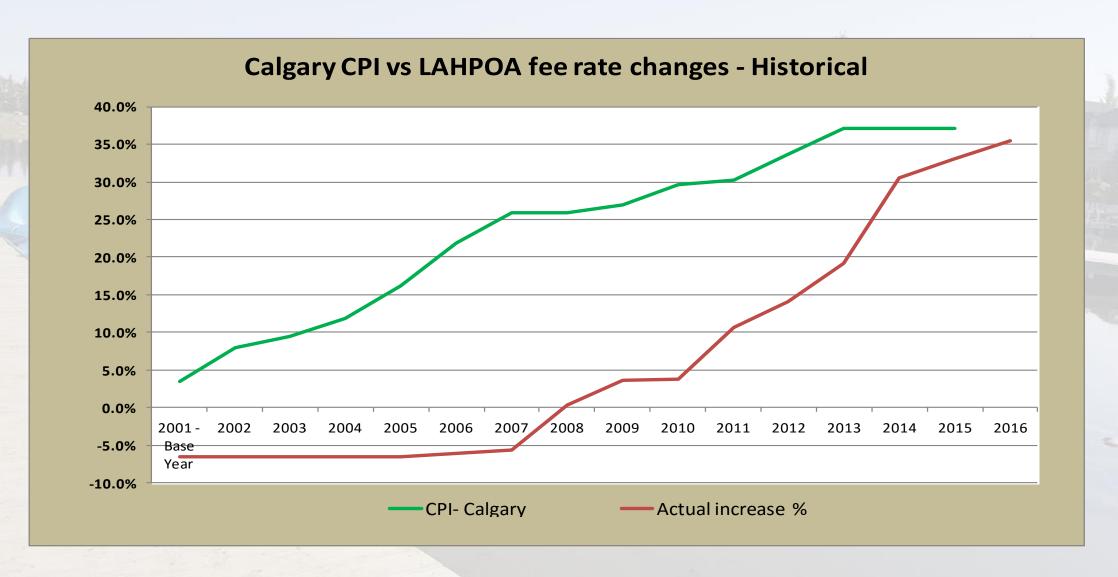

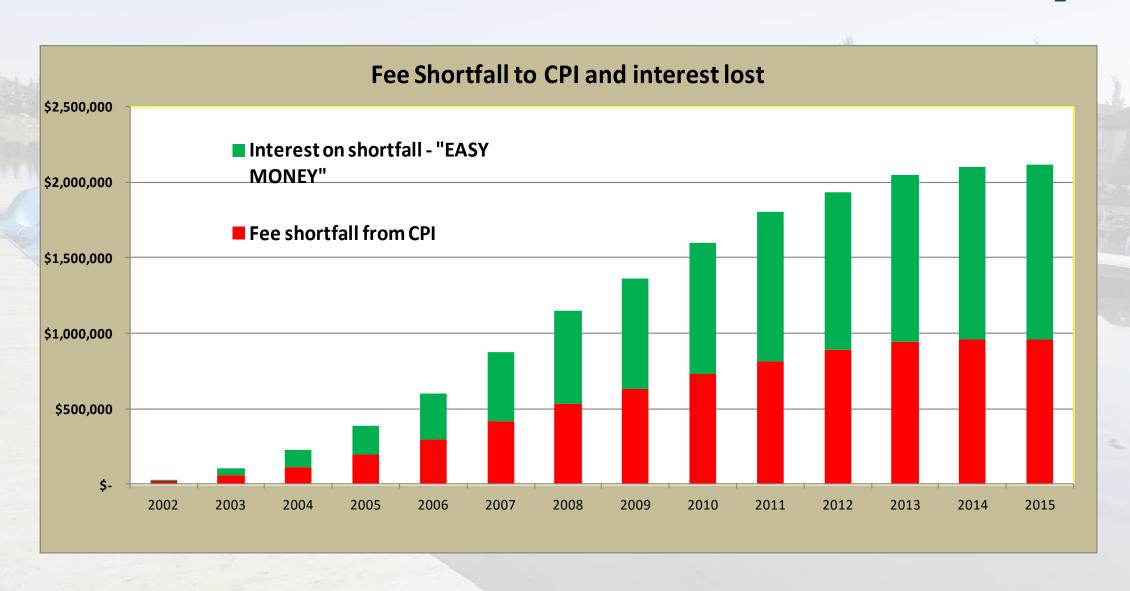
